FORT HUACHUCA SENTINEL LANDSCAPE ARIZONA | Est. 2015

Located in southeastern Arizona, Fort Huachuca is the home of the U.S. Army Intelligence Center of Excellence and the Network Enterprise Technology Command. As a Major Range Test Facility Base, Fort Huachuca is a hub of electromagnetic technology testing and training. The base is also one of the most extensive unmanned aerial vehicle training facilities globally, supporting operations for the U.S. Army, U.S. Air Force, U.S. Marine Corps, and U.S. Customs and Border Protection. The arid, remote landscape surrounding the post primarily consists of broad grassland valleys defined by high-elevation forested mountain ranges, mainly used for livestock grazing. Land uses that protect open space, such as ranching, support Fort Huachuca by ensuring low levels of electromagnetic interference during training activities. However, increasing development pressure in the region, driven by urban sprawl and population growth, poses challenges. Land use conversion and changing climatic conditions contribute

to heightened competition for limited water resources, fragment important wildlife habitats, and encroach upon Fort Huachuca's critical airspace and electronic range. As a response to these challenges, a group of partners formed the Fort Huachuca Sentinel Landscape in 2015. The primary goal of this landscape is to build resilience through collaborative, communitydriven strategies, addressing issues such as water conservation, agricultural viability, wildlife habitat restoration, and the protection of military missions.

Landscape Goals

Preserve the unique natural environment crucial for current and future missions at Fort Huachuca.

Collaborate with willing stakeholders to safeguard working landscapes.



Strengthen conservation collaboration, yielding outcomes that enhance the grasslands, forests, water resources, riparian ecosystems, wildlife habitats, and other natural resources in the landscape.



Empower private landowners by ensuring access to partners and collaborators dedicated to comprehensive conservation planning for agricultural solutions.



Allocate resources strategically, considering future climate-related opportunities and risks for Fort Huachuca, the landscape, and local economies amidst potential challenges like wildfires, flooding, drought, and extreme heat.




